t's already November, which means that the tutoring programs for kids at Johnson Elementary School are in full swing! We're off to a great start by recruiting volunteer tutors faster than ever, enabling us to continue the tradition of 1:1 tutoring. What a picture of God's Kingdom

to see University students, adult volunteers, community members, Trinity Church Fellows and others coming together to love kids on an individual level. The group includes many kids who speak English as a second language. "Over a third of our children are ESL children. It's increased since last year, even more languages. It has created [increased] collaboration with the ESL teacher [at Johnson Elementary]; it's a wonderful collaboration," says Melville Krebs, lesson plan coordinator at CALM's Johnson tutoring program.

But the K-4th grade program has never been just about academics... we like to have fun too! On Oct. 9th as a treat for the kids who are with us on Fridays, we took a busload up to Carter's Mountain Apple Orchard for some hayrides and apple picking! It was a beautiful fall day and the kids truly enjoyed their time.

As exciting as that is, a report of Johnson School activities alone would ignore some awesome new additions to the K-4 tutoring program. We're back in the neighborhood! We have been blessed this year with the expansion of the program beyond the walls of the school to our 834 Prospect Avenue property as well as the Blue Ridge Commons (BRC) Neighborhood Cen-

ter. The program at 834 Prospect Ave. includes sports, games, homework, tutoring, arts and crafts, cooking, and more. It has been a great way to care for kids who aren't at Johnson everyday and to serve working parents who need childcare until 5 pm. An exciting aspect of the 834 property has been the emergence of CALM as a neighborhood fixture. Our ministry is visible to every car that drives by and sees volunteers and community members loving neighborhood kids and offering them a safe place to be.

### earning to Jump By: Ashley Romanias

efore a child can jump, she must find her footing. On September 22, Abundant Life launched a theatre and dance program for 5th and 6th grade girls called Jump.

The program blends expressive dance, forms of exercise and the use of fine arts to create a critical perspective of the world and provide insight into the self. Each girl is given the chance to look inside herself. Every Thursday at 3:30 pm at Walker Upper Elementary School, nine girls board the Abundant Life bus and are taken to Christ Episcopal Church. They begin each class with five minutes of free drawing where they are encouraged to think about their thoughts, feelings and their day as they work.

The girls then move through a series of warm-up exercises and enter the dance portion of class. During this time, they may learn a new dance, create an expression of their own, or practice an existing combination. This time also gives them the opportunity to be instructed by a guest artist on a specialized form of dance (i.e. swing or salsa, step or break). Starting Nov. 1, however, the girls will be hard at work on a routine to perform at the annual Abundant Life Christmas banquet. They will collaborate to create costumes, select music, and develop choreography.

In many cultures, art is called upon to serve as an agent of beauty, an outlet for creativity and a source of entertainment. These functions can enrich the self. Jump aims to use the enriching power of the arts to

help each girl understand herself, respect those around her, and get to know the world in which she lives. Part of Abundant Life's mission is to provide holistic programming. This approach considers the total needs of each child. In addition to academic, spiritual, and social needs, Jump provides artistic and physical outlets for children.

Jump also puts children in a place where they can question, learn, and discover together. During one class, the group got together and discussed inappropriate dancing; what it is, why it happens, and where it can lead. The girls were quick to challenge one another, but eager to find a consensus.

Each child that jumps has her own story. Lanasia wants to be a fashion designer. Carleesha enjoys being in the neighborhood. Wesli loves to look at magazines. At Jump, passions and dreams are key commodities. Thoughts are explored, stories are shared, and dreams are discovered. How else could a young girl find the courage to jump?§
